You Need to Know Pipe Bursting! Pipe bursting is the perfect no-dig process to replace an existing line with a completely new, larger pipe – without excavating. This construction technique is recognized as one of the only methods of trenchless rehabilitation that replaces an existing line with a completely new pipe, providing a total pipe replacement, and allows for the replacement of an existing pipe with a new line of equal or larger diameter – to maintain or increase flow capabilities. *Learn more about the benefits of the pipe bursting method, July 21st in York!*

NEW Course Material! Pipe bursting practice has rapidly evolved in recent years. New techniques have been developed for replacing/re-installing laterals, bypass pumping and segmental pipe installation. The course material has been updated to capture these recent developments. In addition, the course material follows a more natural chronological progression of the pipe bursting process, from planning through construction. Troubleshooting and classroom exercises have been updated and revised to achieve better relevance to real-world design and construction issues.

Who Should Attend? Engineering consultants; utility engineers and managers; government engineers and public works managers; contractors; and others with responsibilities for implementing or managing construction projects using trenchless construction techniques.

Dr. Samuel T. Ariaratnam, P.E. is a Professor in the Ira A. Fulton School of Engineering at Arizona State University. He received his B.A.Sc. in Civil Engineering from the University of Waterloo and his M.S. and Ph.D. from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. He is a co-author of the *Horizontal Directional Drilling Good Practices Guidelines* and the *Pipe Bursting Good Practices* manuals with Dr. David Bennett. He is a registered professional engineer in Arizona and Ontario.
